Summer special education learning supports

The Board will be offering summer learning programs.

Three CDC's, four EA's and a DLRT have been hired for the summer to help support elementary & secondary and the program team.

The Board has been working alongside LearnStyle and six virtual camps will be offered over the summer. This will be geared towards grade 4-8 students.

A descriptor has been sent out to principals who will follow up with their families.

There is one LearnStyle coach for five or so students. These sessions will be offered in August so not to disrupt any summer learning programs in place in July.

Ministry dollars have been received for student transition activities the last few weeks of August to help prepare students for return to school in September.

Transition activities will include students in regular classes with anxiety, students with EA support and special education classes.

Land acknowledgement

The Board's Indigenous lead Tracy Hendrick has been working hard to put together a land acknowledgement guidebook.

This will best support schools and staff in creating their own.

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The land acknowledgement is not a script but evolves with time. It should be tailored to the land and the situation currently being experienced.

The group discussed ideas and thoughts around the introduction, recognition of land and what is authentic to SEAC. Any follow up ideas can be emailed to the group.

It was suggested to have an education piece with this, so people have a better understanding of the history of a land acknowledgement. A guest speaker could be asked to join the next SEAC meeting who could help provide a better insight into this.

Climate Change

There is much misinformation out there on climate change.

Trustee Bottomley spoke about the increased carbon dioxide production, the reliance on fossil fuels and global warming.

It has become a crisis and our students will inherit our footprint.

Trustee Bottomley relayed to the group his wanting for more electric cars and the immediate need for climate change to be a priority for our government.

The group was encouraged to reach out to Trustee Bottomley for any follow up.
